

<b>HB 21 Sales Tax Exemption Repeal (by Trell):</b> This Legislation would sunset all sales and use tax exemptions by June 30, 2010.	OPPOSE
<b>HB 47 Eminent Domain, Fair Market Value (by ITD):</b> Does not allow project influence to be considered when determining fair market value.	OPPOSE
<b>HB 48 Eminent Domain, Atty Fees and Costs (by ITD):</b> Reduces the amount of attorney fees and costs that can be recovered from ITD in an eminent domain case.	OPPOSE
<b>HB 52 PUC, New Tax on New Customers (by Stevenson):</b> Would allow the PUC to authorize public utilities to charge an additional tax on new customers.	OPPOSE
<b>HB 54 Eminent Domain, Compensation (by ITD):</b> Reduces the amount of interest paid by ITD on eminent domain cases.	OPPOSE
<b>HB 135 2 Cent Fuel Tax Increase (by Wood):</b> Increases the fuel tax by 2 cents.	MONITOR
<b>HB 169 Residential Mortgage Practices Act (by Finance):</b> This legislation updates the existing act to comply with some new federal standards.	MONITOR
<b>HB 188 Real Estate License Law (by IAR):</b> This legislation adds to sections to the duties to a client to clarify that brokerages can represent more than one client looking for similar properties, and that there is no imputed knowledge between agents in an office when there is no reason for them to have such knowledge.	SUPPORT
<b>HB 189 Real Estate - Trust Accounts (by IAR):</b> This legislation clarifies that agents can accept earnest money from their clients and deliver the earnest money to a third party trust account (with written permission from the client).	SUPPORT
<b>HB 190 Representation Agreements, Legal Description (by IAR):</b> This legislation will change the requirement in a representation agreement from a "legally enforceable" description of the property to a general description of the property.	SUPPORT
<b>HB 191 Foreclosure Disclosure Form (by IAR):</b> This legislation would amend the statute with regard to the RE-42 to remove the requirement that it be printed on yellow paper.	SUPPORT
<b>HB 196 Validation of Right Away (by White Peterson Law Firm):</b> This legislation would allow cities the ability to settle disputes over rights of way through the validation process.	OPPOSE
<b>HB 202 Fire Marshall Powers and Duties (by Boyle):</b> This legislation limits the power of the State Fire Marshall to enforcing the IFC on state owned buildings.	SUPPORT
<b>HB 213 Invasive Species Legislation (by Anderson):</b> This legislation would create a permanent funding source to fight invasive species in Idaho.	SUPPORT
<b>HB 216 Fire Sprinklers in Residential Dwellings (by Hart):</b> This legislation makes it clear that Idaho will not adopt portions of the International Codes that require fire sprinklers in residential dwellings.	SUPPORT
<b>HB 220 Relating to the State Building Code Board (by Black):</b> This bill would add a builder to the SBCB, and would create a process for the Board to amend adopted codes through a negotiated rulemaking process.	SUPPORT
<b>HB 234 Trust Deeds, Foreclosure (by Idaho Bankers Assn):</b> This legislation would allow a property owner that is being foreclosed on via a deed of trust 90 days to attempt to sell the property to satisfy the debt.	MONITOR
<b>HB 235 Foreclosures and Deficiency Judgments (by Luker):</b> Creates a single action rule for mortgages.	MONITOR
<b>HB 236 Trust Deeds, Foreclosures (by Luker):</b> Creates a single action rule for trust deeds	MONITOR
<b>HB 242 Extends Sunset on Small Employer Incentive Act (by Simpson):</b> Would extend the sunset to 2020 on the SEIA.	SUPPORT
<b>HB 246 Fuel Tax Increase (by Gov. Otter):</b> Would raise the fuel tax by 7 cents over 3 years.	SUPPORT
