

## Absentee Registration

**Registration in Person** at absentee polling place must occur not later than **5:00 PM on the day before the election**. Election Day Registration procedures apply.

### **Election Day Registration Procedure.**

**Photo identification is an absolute requirement for Election Day Registration.**

#### **Proof of Residence:**

- Driver's license or Idaho identification card issued through Department of Transportation or;
- Student identification card from a post-secondary educational institution in Idaho accompanied with a current student fee statement that contains the student's valid address in the precinct together with a picture identification card or;
- Document which contains a valid address in the precinct – accompanied with a picture identification card. (If the address on the driver's license is not current – the photo still works with a document which contains name of individual and current address.)

**Registration by Mail** must be received or postmarked not later than **25 days prior to the election**.

#### **Verification of a Mail Registration. First Time Voter for Federal Office.**

A mail registration received from an elector who has not previously voted in an election for federal office in the state needs to be verified prior to the issuance of a ballot.

Not required for FPCA Registration Applications.

At the time a registration is entered into the statewide voter registration system, the system will attempt to validate the person's identification by either of the following matches:

- Driver's License number through the Department of Transportation.
- Name and Date of Birth through the Social Security Administration.

If the system validates the voter's identification, no further proof or action is required.

**How to Verify if Necessary:**

Documentation can be provided at the time of registration or at the polling place.

**Proof of Identification:**

- A current valid photo identification.

**Or:**

- A copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document that shows the name and address of the voter.
