

HAVA Compliance At The Polling Place

Verification of a Mail Registration. First Time Voter for Federal Office.

A mail registration received from an elector who has not previously voted in an election for federal office in the state needs to be verified prior to the issuance of a ballot.

Not required for FPCA Registration Applications.

At the time a registration is entered into the statewide voter registration system, the system will attempt to validate the person's identification by either of the following matches:

- Driver's License number through the Department of Transportation.
- Name and Date of Birth through the Social Security Administration.

If the system validates the voter's identification, no further proof or action is required.

How to Verify if Necessary:

Documentation can be provided at the time of registration or at the polling place.

Proof of Identification:

- A current valid photo identification.

Or:

- A copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document that shows the name and address of the voter.

Voter Information

Voting Information Must be Posted At Every Polling Place on Election Day.

- A sample of the ballot used for that election.
- Instructions on how to vote, including how to cast a vote.
- General information on voting rights under applicable federal and state laws.
- Instructions on how to contact the appropriate officials if these rights have been violated.

- General information on federal and state laws prohibiting fraud and misrepresentation.

Disability Access

Polling places must be physically accessible to persons with disabilities. One accessible voting device in every polling place is required.
