

Bill Number and Description	IAR Position on the Issue
HOUSE BILLS	
HB 354 (by Ringo): Amends, repeals and adds to existing law to place the sales and use tax on services and to decrease the rate of the sales and use tax to five percent.	OPPOSE
HB 387a (by Luker): Allows active duty military personnel and people who leave on religious or humanitarian missions to maintain their homeowner's exemption in Idaho so long as their Idaho home remains their primary residence – even if rented out during their absence	SUPPORT
HB 410 (by Century Link): Idaho Video Services Act	SUPPORT
HB 433 (by Chew): This is the ICAN version of the Health Insurance Exchange Act.	OPPOSE
HB 434 (by Chew): This legislation would remove the ability of a trustee to pursue a deficiency judgement.	OPPOSE
Hb 452 (by Eric Simpson): This legislation adds requirements of the taxing district to provide a statement as to the purpose for which the bonds are to be used, disclose the interest amount of the bonds, and to disclose when the bonds will be paid off or retired.	MONITOR
HB 453 (by Eric Simpson): This legislation adds similar requirements to HB 453 for levy elections.	MONITOR
HB 469 (by Guthrie): This legislation allows certain elevators to not have to be upgraded to new code standards if the cost exceeds \$5000.	SUPPORT
HB 504 (by Sims):: This legislation would require that board members of Urban Renewal Agencies be elected in some circumstances. The legislation was held in committee.	NONE
HB 506 (by Nonini): HB 506 removes eminent domain authority from URDs.	OPPOSE
HB 507a (by Thompson): This legislation attempts to put some side boards on what type of projects a URD can become involved in – requiring that the projects be specifically outlined in the URD plan	MONITOR
HB 509 (by Wood-35): HB 509 creates a requirement for an airport impact area which will include new zoning requirements around airports. The bill would also allow ITD to designate aviation hazards.	OPPOSE
HB 519 (by Hartgen): This legislation would keep land that is being developed taxed at the platted lot rate until the lots are sold or built on.	SUPPORT
HB 527 (by Simpson): This legislation would put a two year ban on new wind energy projects and create and interim legislative task force to study statewide standards for siting of new turbines.	MONITOR
HB 535 (by Historical Society): This legislation would consolidate state and county record keeping. It would also require a study to look for future financing options.	MONITOR
HB 538 Newspaper Notices (by Ells): This legislation would change the amount of time a weekly newspaper has to be in business to publish foreclosure notices.	OPPOSE
HB 539 (by Century Link): Redraft of HB 410.	SUPPORT
HB 546 (by Dept. of Commerce): Creates the IGEM Fund	SUPPORT
HB 547 (by Hartgen): Requires a public vote on all bond indebtedness prior to the use of the judicial confirmation process, and would place new requirements of the process.	MONITOR

<u>HB 559 State Budget Cap (by Moyle):</u> Amends the existing cap on the state budget to 5.33% of personal income.	
	OPPOSE
<u>HB 560 URDs (by Schaefer):</u> Repeals URD law.	
	SUPPORT
<u>HB 561 Wind Moratorium (by Simpson):</u> Would create a two year moratorium on wind power plants and create a legislative committee that would meet to discuss potential new siting requirements for Idaho.	
	SUPPORT
<u>HB 563 Income Taxes (by Otter):</u> would lower the corporate and personal income tax rates to 7.4%	
	MONITOR
<u>HB 580 URDs (by Roberts):</u> This legislation would require a 2/3 vote to issue bonds or any other liability lasting more than one year.	
	SUPPORT
<u>HB 583 Access Easements (by Winder):</u> This legislation clarifies that a deeded access easement can be used for multiple types of access (commercial, agricultural, etc) if the easement does not specify a use.	
	SUPPORT
<u>HB 584a HOE (by Winder):</u> HB 584 allows the exemption to continue upon the death of the owner during the year the death occurred and one additional year after that until the property is transferred.	
	SUPPORT
<u>HB 587a Out of State Insurance (by Ellsworth):</u> This legislation allows insurance companies that are not domiciled in Idaho, but comply with Idaho laws to be able to sell insurance in Idaho.	
	MONITOR
<u>HB 592 New Construction Rolls (by Moyle):</u> HB 592 removes property that becomes exempt (such as when a hospital buys a new property) from the new construction roll in an attempt to eliminate any tax shift that may occur.	
	MONITOR
<u>HB 593 CIDs (by Luker):</u> This legislation amends the CID legislation from a few years ago. It has been negotiated with the sponsor of the original legislation and there is no opposition.

<u>HB 597 URDs (by Sims):</u> This legislation is a redraft of HB 504 regarding electing the board of a URD.	
	MONITOR
<u>HB 599 (by Historical Society):</u> This is a redraft of HB 535.	
	SUPPORT
<u>HB 614 Special Use Permits (by IAR, et al):</u> This legislation would fix the Supreme Court ruling in the Burns case.	
	SUPPORT
<u>HB 624 Trust Deeds (by Psjca):</u> This legislation would require that a trustee that is publishing a notice of a trustees sale not have a financial interest in the newspaper that is publishing the notice	
	MONITOR
<u>HB 629 Appointment of Hearings Officers (by Luker):</u> Would create a random registry of hearings officers through the Department of Administration.	
	OPPOSE
<u>HJR 001 (by Vick, et al):</u> This amendment would require a two-thirds vote of the legislature to increase any tax or fee.

<u>SB 1225 (by IREC):</u> Move the cap on the amount IREC can contract with an exam provider for from \$100 to \$150 per exam.	
	SUPPORT
<u>SB 1226 (by IREC):</u> Moves the cap for E&O Insurance costs that the Commission offers to licensees from \$200 to \$250.	
	SUPPORT
<u>SB 1227 (by IREC):</u> Clarifies that when licensees apply for CE credit for classes taught for other professions that those classes must conform to IREC requirements for distance learning.

<u>SB 1246 (by Senate D's):</u> Removes all exemptions and credits from the state income tax and the sales tax.	OPPOSE

<u>SB 1249 (by Senate D's):</u> Moves the HOE to \$150,000 resulting in a huge tax shift to other properties.	
<u>SB 1251 (by Bock and Werk):</u> Would ban cell phone use in cars except when using a hands-free device.	OPPOSE

<u>SB 1252 (by Bock and Werk):</u> Would ban texting while driving.	
	SUPPORT
<u>SB 1274a (by Hammond):</u> Bans texting while driving. Makes texting an infraction.	
<u>SB 1288 (by Water Users Assn):</u> This legislation would allow irrigation districts to construct and repair structures within a canal or ditch that is in a floodplain without having to obtain a permit from the local jurisdiction.	OPPOSE

<u>SB 1317a GARVEE (by Hammond):</u> This legislation would allow the remaining unallocated GARVEE funding to be used for bridge repair and expansion.

<u>SB 1378 Ditches and Canals (by Water Users):</u> This is a redraft of HB 1288

<u>SCR 116 (by Hammond):</u> This resolution calls for the creation of a legislative interim committee to study the cost and viability of obtaining primacy for the NPDES program.
